LESSONS AND LITURGY TODAY

"By what authority are You doing these things, and who gave You this authority?" The answer has everything to do with who Jesus is. We believe that Jesus came "from Heaven" and is the Christ, the Son of God. He proved His Authority over sin, death, and the devil by His Suffering, Death, and Resurrection from the dead. We hear Him, believe His Forgiveness and rejoice that He, by the Means of Grace through His Word and Sacraments, forgives our sins; and gives us new, Eternal Life.

WELCOME TO THE LORD'S TABLE

The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated at this worship service. All who are baptized in the name of the Triune God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) and who affirm the following are welcome to come forward to receive it:

- I am a fallen and sinful person in need of God's forgiveness;
- ➤ The Sacrament is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine instituted by Christ Himself for us to eat and to drink;
- In the Sacrament, everyone who believes the words "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," receives forgiveness of sins, life and salvation.

At Resurrection Lutheran Church children who are baptized as infants are instructed so that they may receive Holy Communion understanding what it is we are looking for, and why we are coming. Newcomers to Resurrection Lutheran Church receive the opportunity for in-depth catechetical instruction. If you and/or your children of any age are not prepared to receive the Lord's Supper with this same statement of faith, you are requested to refrain from receiving Holy Communion at this time.

We do, however, welcome you and the members of your family to come forward to receive a blessing. Please either stand still with head bowed or fold your arms across your body as a sign to receive the verbal blessing.

Grape juice is available in the center of each tray of individual cups for those who cannot tolerate wine; and gluten free wafers are also available in the center of the paten, if needed. If you have any questions, please speak with an usher.

Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better yourselves. Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.

Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus:

Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped; but made Himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant,

being made in human likeness.

And being found in appearance as a man,

He humbled Himself and became obedient to death—even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted Him to the highest place and gave Him the Name that is above every name,

that at the Name of Jesus every knee should bow, in Heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the Glory of God the Father.

for it is God Who works in you to will and to act in according to His Good Purpose. Do everything without complaining or arguing, so that you may become blameless and pure, Children of God without fault in a crooked and depraved generation, in which you shine like stars in the universe as you hold out the Word of Life-in order that I may boast on the Day of Christ that I did not run or labor for nothing. DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

Maintaining physical space of 6 feet behind and to the side of each communicant (small children may stand with parents), please follow usher instructions to enter the central aisle and approach the distribution area. There are six small tables between the pews and chancel area. Worshippers sitting on the left side of the sanctuary (facing the altar) will turn left to commune, and those sitting on the right side will turn to the right. Having removed your mask, please approach the first table corresponding to the side of the sanctuary where you are seated. It contains a large paten for communion host (gluten free wafers are available in the middle of the paten). Receive the host while standing to the side of these tables. Upon receiving the host, please approach the tray of individual cups at the worship leader's guiding and receive the wine to the side of the table. Empty cups are placed in the tray or basket on the third table. We recommend removing your mask to receive Holy Communion by touching ear loops or head straps only.

The "Friendship" Epistle, 2: Rejoicing Together (Philippians 2:1–18) Proper 21/Series A

We continue our focus on Philippians. St. Paul shares a song of praise with the Philippian church, he is rejoicing with them and inviting them to rejoice together with him. His is not merely an invitation to "put on a happy face" or have a positive attitude; it's a proclamation in song of what Christ has done for people to bring them together that they might a shine a light in the world's dark places (Philippians 2:15).

I.	St. Paul starts with an	: "Empty yourselves!" (Phil. 2:3, 7)
	a A life where rejoin	sing seems to have fallen silent might be due to ou

- a. A life where rejoicing seems to have fallen silent might be due to our being so "full of ourselves"
- b. Luther's description of the default human life: humanity "curved in" upon itself and unaware that it is so
- c. We cannot by our own reason or strength sing a song of joy; the humility that St. Paul describes can only be a gift from God
- II. St. Paul continues with a _____: "Jesus Christ emptied Himself for us...even dying for us on a cross" (Phil 2:6–11)
 - a. The message of the hymn is important! God's love for us is so profound that it started with Jesus' humbling himself from heaven and was completed by Jesus' humbling himself on a cross!
 - b. A visit to a memory care facility and what it taught me about God's love for us, the gift of joy, and our love for one another
 - c. Songs and hymns reflect a life of rejoicing that has been begun by Jesus: "Paul knew that this hymn to Christ [takes our] attention away from [our]selves, puts it on Christ, and joins [us] together in lives of self-sacrificial love" (Schmitt).
- III. St. Paul ends on a _____: I am rejoicing with you!" (2:17)
 - a. We need not be a Moses or a St. Peter to be a hero in God's eyes! Notice the ordinary "heroes" in this letter: Timothy and Epaphroditus performing acts of "mutual service," "mutual suffering," "carrying holy words," and "holy deeds" within the body of believers and in so doing are evidence that the Philippians and Paul were rejoicing together.
 - b. The Holy Spirit draws us together in worship right now and will live in us this week and the weeks ahead as we are led by God to rejoice together in service to one another.
 - c. Next Sunday we will feature service opportunities to one another and our community. Our song of rejoicing together continues!
