Lessons and Liturgy Today

At creation, God called forth into existence everything by the power of His Word; and everything was good. Sin brought disease and death. In our Baptism, God is at work restoring us in Christ by the power of His Mighty Word. Because of Jesus' Baptism, we go into baptism's living waters as dirty, marked with death, only to rise up clean and marked for new and everlasting life. Jesus' Baptism identified Him as the Lamb of God Who takes away the sin of the world; our Baptism imparts to us the new identity as Children of God. Here God marks us and claims us: "You belong to Me."

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

C God, our Father, We remember this day that we are Yours, and yet we draw back into ourselves. Though we are bought with the price of the death of Your Son, we live as though we are on our own.

C Though we are washed clean of past sins, we cannot let go of our guilt. Though we have heard Your Words of love, we still manipulate and seek to control others.
Forgive us, Lord. Remind us that we too are beloved by You. Bring us, this day, back to our Baptism. Washed in Your Love, let us leave this place today to live anew as Your people.

P In His own Son, God reveals to us His mercy and love. As a called and ordained servant of the Word, I announce the Grace of God to all of you. In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
✘ God has announced that you are His beloved in whom He is well pleased. You have been washed clean. Rejoice in this Gospel news.

New Testament Epistle

Romans 6:1-11

What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the Glory of the Father, we too may live a New Life. If we have been united with Him like this in His death, we will

certainly also be united with Him in His resurrection. For we know that our old self was crucified with Him so that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin-- because anyone who has died has been freed from sin.

Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also Live with Him. For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, He cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over Him. The death He died, He died to sin once for all; but the Life He lives, He lives to God. In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Holy Gospel

Mark 4:1-11

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the fourth chapter.

C Glory to You, O Lord.

And so John came, baptizing in the desert region and preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. And this was his message: "After me will come One more powerful than I, the thongs of Whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I baptize you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. As Jesus was coming up out of the water, He saw Heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on Him like a dove. And a Voice came from Heaven: "You are My Son, Whom I love; with You I Am well pleased."

Baptism: A “Saving Flood” (Mark 1:4–11) Baptism of Our Lord, Series B

A deadly disorder exists inside every human heart. Baptized into Jesus' death and resurrection, we are people in whom the Holy Spirit lives! We enjoy new beginnings and live out a countercultural love for one another (even our enemies).

1. **Chaos existed at the _____, yet the Creator, by the Word and presence of the Spirit, brought forth life out of it (Gen 1:1–10)**
 - a. The earth was “formless and void” and the earth's water “deep.”

- b. God revealed as Father/Creator, Word, and Spirit is present at the beginning, speaking Life and order out of disorder and darkness.
 - c. An essentially modern worldview (progress and technology are everything) has run up against post-modernism (history has no meaning and “the Truth” = whatever I feel is “my truth”).
 - d. Into this chaos God speaks order and light today! The Word made flesh is the baptized Christ, “beloved Son” of the Father.
- 2. Chaos tainted by violence resulted in a “saving flood,” used by God to rescue _____ and _____...for a new beginning (Gen 6–9)**
- a. Consider the prayer read at every baptism (*LSB* pp. 268-9); “saving flood” implies an instrument of death that brings life.
 - b. We witnessed anarchy in our nation’s capital this week, but the truth is that the anarchy of sin (the “old man/woman”) is in every human heart.
 - c. Jesus’ baptism connects His ministry as God’s Son with His death on a cross (cf. Mark 15:38-39), an instrument of death that also brings life!
- 3. Jesus broke the power chaos in our hearts so that we the baptized, by the _____, might “_____ in newness of _____” (Rom 6:4)**
- a. Our baptism has rescued us to live out a new beginning (1 Peter 3:21).
 - b. Confessing our sins, the “old man” in us dies to sin and we are raised with Christ again and again.
 - c. Having died to sin we live to love the un-loveable...even our enemies.
