LESSONS AND LITURGY TODAY

But when Jesus seemed uninterested in capitalizing on that popularity and to continue on preaching elsewhere, Peter didn't understand. Jesus did not come only to heal or to make "a kingdom of this world" (*John 18:36*). He came to take our burdens and sins to the cross; to pay the price that delivers the whole world from sin and death. We "proclaim the Lord's Death until He comes." For by the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus the Grace of God appears to all.

EPISTLE

I Corinthians 9:16-27

(We strive to be all things to all people to share the Gospel and its blessings.)

Yet when I preach the Gospel, I cannot boast, for I am compelled to preach. Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel! If I preach voluntarily, I have a reward; if not voluntarily, I am simply discharging the trust committed to me. What then is my reward? Just this: that in preaching the Gospel I may offer it free of charge, and so not make use of my rights in preaching it. Though I am free and belong to no man, I make myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible.

To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win the Jews. To those under the Law I became like one under the Law (though I myself am not under the Law), so as to win those under the Law. To those not having the Law I became like one not having the Law (though I am not free from God's Law but am under Christ's Law), so as to win those not having the Law. To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some.

I do all this for the sake of the Gospel,
that I may share in its blessings.
Do you not know that in a race all the
runners run, but only one gets the prize?
Run in such a way as to get the prize.
Everyone who competes in the games
goes into strict training.
They do it to get a crown that will not last;
but we do it to get a crown that will last
forever.

Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else-- to the nearby villages--so I can preach there also. That is why I have come."

So He traveled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons.

Fifth Sunday after the Epiphany
Real Issues, Real Grace, 4: God's Love Languages at Work through Us
(1 Corinthians 9:16–27)

Whether or not God has called us to leave home for another land, we are called to serve with the Gospel of Christ as people who meet others *where they are at* rather than where we feel they should be. Our calling is to be pioneers of the heart...so that we might bring a saving Word of life to others and gain them *there*, on behalf of the Kingdom. After all, Jesus gave up all for you and me...and did so not based on our meeting Him halfway. Instead, “while we were still *sinners*, Christ died, for us” (Rom 5:8).

1. **Today is the fourth and final part from our series on 1 Corinthians.** The focus for our series today is that of participating in God's mission to a lost world.
2. ***St. Paul is bound to preach the Gospel as _____ of no one, yet _____ of all (9:19).*** St. Paul's is a calling, not a job. His life's work is as one loved by God in Christ, rather than one who must either prove something to himself or become what others expect him to become. He works to be all things to all people *for the purpose of saving some*. That was God's love language at work through Paul.
3. ***By the grace of God we are freed to live more than an _____ (9:26): the Spirit at work in us keeps our eyes focused on an _____.*** The Olympian runner runs with determination. Is it our calling to become more comfortable in life...or to serve others with integrity? Is it our calling to surround ourselves with like-minded people, or be sent into the world to make a difference?
4. ***God's love language at work through RLC missionaries Mark and Megan Mantey***
5. ***Jesus was _____ to live any way he chose yet sacrifice Himself to be _____ on a cross) for us.*** In Jesus we too are slaves of no one, yet servants of all. We seek to be the way God speaks His love language to the world, through us.
