LESSONS AND LITURGY TODAY

The Sundays of Easter celebrate the greatest of all victories - the defeat of sin, death, and the devil by Jesus Christ, the Son of God. The theme of victory fills each of the Sundays of Easter and radiates out the joy of the first Easter morning. The Hymn of Praise begins with the words, "This is the feast of victory for our God." This joyful truth is to be re-echoed through all of the worship of God's people on earth as it is endlessly proclaimed by the hosts of Heaven!

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Acts 3:11-21

(Peter preaches in the heart of Jerusalem.)

While the beggar held on to Peter and John, all the people were astonished and came running to them in the place called Solomon's Colonnade.

When Peter saw this, he said to them: "Men of Israel, why does this surprise you? Why do you stare at us as if by our own power or godliness we had made this man walk?

The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified His Servant Jesus.

You handed Him over to be killed, and you disowned Him before Pilate, though He had decided to let Him go. You disowned the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. You killed the Author of Life, but God raised Him from the dead. We are witnesses of this. By faith in the Name of Jesus, this man whom you see and know was made

strong.

It is Jesus' Name and the faith that comes through Him that has given this complete healing to him, as you can all see.

"Now, brothers, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did your leaders.

But this is how God fulfilled what He had foretold through all the prophets, saying that His Christ would suffer.

Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord, and that He may send the Christ, Who has been appointed for you—even Jesus. He must remain in Heaven until the time comes for God to restore everything, as He promised long ago through His holy prophets.

(St. John reminds us that we are God's children now.)

How great is the Love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!

And that is what we are!

The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know Him.

Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known.

But we know that when He appears, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is.

Everyone who has this hope in Him purifies himself, just as He is pure.

Everyone who sins breaks the Law; in fact, sin is lawlessness.

But you know that He appeared so that He might take away our sins.

And in Him is no sin.

No one who lives in Him keeps on sinning.

No one who continues to sin has either seen Him or known Him.

Dear children, do not let anyone lead you astray.

He who does what is right is righteous, just as He is righteous.

Easter Hope that Never Gives Up Rev. Dr. Jonathan Blanke *I John 3:1-7*

♦ AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Luther's Explanation to the Second Article of the Ancient Apostles' Creed

I believe that Jesus Christ – true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true Man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, Who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His Holy, Precious Blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His Kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.

♦ GREETING OF PEACE

All are invited to greet one another in the name of the Lord, saying, "Peace be with you," as a sign of reconciliation and of the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. (Matt. 5:22–24; Eph. 4:1–3) Any gesture accompanying this greeting (wave, hand over heart with slight bow) is welcome.
