

THE ORDER OF THE DIVINE SERVICE THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER May 2, 2021 – 9:30 am

A warm welcome to all worshiping with Resurrection Lutheran Church today. In May of 2020, we celebrated forty-two years of ministry. Celebrating our Savior's love continues today in the faithful gathering of God's people, whether we are together in God's house or as you watch online from the comfort of your home.

LESSONS AND LITURGY TODAY

As branches are to the vine, so are we to Christ. We are not alone, nor can we exist alone; it is only in connection with Christ that life flows to us and through us. It is only in Christ that we see who we are meant to be and what fruit we are meant to bear. Easter teaches us a brand-new meaning to Christ's Promise to abide in us. Not even death can keep Him from living within His people by Baptism and faith. In order to sustain His Life in us, we are called to remain in Him, to stay connected to the Vine so that we branches may bear the good fruit of His Kingdom.

Today we rejoice with the young women and men of our congregation who publicly confirm the vows made at their Baptism. We affirm them in their confession, even as we recall our own commitment to walk with our Lord. May God's Holy Spirit guide each of us as we daily give testimony of our faith; and as we resolve to grow in our knowledge of God and His Will for our lives.

WELCOME TO THE LORD'S TABLE

The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated at this worship service. All who are baptized in the name of the Triune God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) and who affirm the following are welcome to come forward to receive it:

- > I am a fallen and sinful person in need of God's forgiveness;
- The Sacrament is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine instituted by Christ Himself for us to eat and to drink;
- In the Sacrament, everyone who believes the words "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," receives forgiveness of sins, life and salvation.

At Resurrection Lutheran Church, children who are baptized as infants are instructed so that they may receive Holy Communion understanding what it is we are looking for, and why we are coming. Newcomers to Resurrection Lutheran Church receive the opportunity for in-depth catechetical

instruction. If you and/or your children of any age are not prepared to receive the Lord's Supper with this same statement of faith, you are requested to refrain from receiving Holy Communion at this time.

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Acts 8:26-40

(Philip brings the Easter Gospel to an Ethiopian and baptizes him into new life in Christ.)

Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Go south to the road---the desert road--that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." So he started out, and on his way he met an Ethiopian eunuch, an important official in charge of all the treasury of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians. This man had gone to Jerusalem to worship and on his way home was sitting in his chariot reading the book of Isaiah the prophet. The Spirit told Philip,

"Go to that chariot and stay near it." Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. Philip asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?"

He said, "How can I, unless someone explains it to me?"

So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him.

The eunuch was reading this passage of Scripture:

"He was led like a sheep to the slaughter; and as a lamb before the shearer is silent, so He did not open His Mouth. In His humiliation He was deprived of justice. Who can speak of His descendants? For His Life was taken from the earth."

The eunuch asked Philip,

"Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the Good News about Jesus.

As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said,

"Look, here is water.

Why shouldn't I be baptized?"

And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him.

When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way rejoicing. Philip, however, appeared at Azotus and traveled about, preaching the Gospel in all the towns until he reached Caesarea. A This is the Word of the Lord.

Epistle

(True faith is found in believers who acknowledge Jesus and live in Him, who listen to His Word, and who love one another.)

Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, but every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even now is already in the world. You, dear children, are from God and have overcome them, because the One Who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world. They are from the world and therefore speak from the viewpoint of the world, and the world listens to them. We are from God, and whoever knows God listens to us; but whoever is not from God does not listen to us. This is how we recognize the Spirit of Truth and the spirit of falsehood. Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is Love. This is how God showed His Love among us: He sent His One and Only Son into the world that we might live through Him.

This is love: not that we loved God. but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and His Love is made complete in us. We know that we live in Him and He in us; because He has given us of His Spirit. And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent His Son to be the Savior of the world. If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in him and he in God. And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is Love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in him. In this way, love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the Day of Judgment, because in this world we are like Him. There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love. We love because He first loved us. If anyone says, "I love God," vet hates his brother, he is a liar.

1 John 4:1-21

For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, Whom he has not seen.

If you remain in Me and My Words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be given you. This is to My Father's Glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be My disciples.

And He has given us this command: Whoever loves God must also love his brother.

RITE OF CONFIRMATION

Confirmation marks the completion of our congregation's confirmation instruction, a period of passing on to our children the Christian faith as confessed in the teachings of the Lutheran Church. Those who have completed this program were made members of the church in Baptism. Confirmation includes a public profession of the faith into which the candidates were baptized, thus underscoring God's action in their Baptism.

P Dear brothers and sisters, at the Baptism of these young men and women, their parents and sponsors promised to provide for their spiritual growth and training. Today we give thanks to God for the work, which parents have done to prepare

their children for faithful living. We also thank God for the work parents will continue to do as they teach and model the Christian faith for these young men and women.

C Thanks to You, O Lord, for the faithful work of parents.

- P These young people have been instructed in the Christian faith and desire to make public affirmation of their Baptism. We rejoice that they now desire to do this and assume greater responsibility in the life of our Christian community and its mission in the world.
- P In Holy Baptism our Lord Jesus Christ received you and made you members of His Church. In the community of God's people, you have learned from His Word God's Loving Purpose for you and all creation. You have been nourished at His Holy Table and called to be witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Now therefore, I ask you:

Do you renounce all the forces of evil, the devil, and all his empty promises? *I do.*

P Do you believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth?

R Yes, I believe.

R

P Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried.
He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead.
He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty.
From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead?

R Yes, I believe.

- P Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting?
- R Yes, I believe.
- P Do you hold all the prophetic and apostolic Scriptures to be the inspired Word of God?
- R I do.

- P Do you confess the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, drawn from the Scriptures, as you have learned to know it from the Small Catechism, to be faithful and true?
- R I do.
- P Do you intend to hear the Word of God and receive the Lord's Supper faithfully?
- *R* I do, by the Grace of God.
- P Do you intend to live according to the Word of God, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?
- *R* I do, by the Grace of God.
- P Do you intend to continue steadfast in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?
- *R* I do, by the Grace of God.
- P We rejoice with thankful hearts that you have been baptized and have received the teaching of the Lord. You have confessed the faith and been absolved of your sins. As you continue to hear the Lord's Word and receive His blessed Sacrament, He who has begun a good work in you will bring it to completion at the Day of Jesus Christ.
- C Amen.
- P Let us pray.

Gracious Lord, through water and the Spirit You have made these young people Your own. You forgave them all their sins and brought them to newness of life.

- P Continue to strengthen them with the Holy Spirit, and daily increase in them Your Gifts of Grace: the Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding, the Spirit of Counsel and Might, the Spirit of Knowledge and respect of the Lord, the Spirit of the joy of Your Presence; through Jesus Christ Your Son, our Lord.

The presiding minister exchanges the peace of the Lord with each of them. They exchange the peace with one another and other members of the congregation.

God's Love Letter, 4: Love Perfected, Love Lived Out (1 John 4:1–21) Easter 5

We cannot say that we love God (whom we have not seen) yet continue to hate our brother or sister (whom we *have* seen).

- 1. Today is the fourth week of a 5-week series on 1 John, a letter all about God's love for us—and because of God's love for us, our love for one another. Today John's theme is discerning the true from the false (4:1–6) about Jesus...and how the crucified and resurrected Christ grounds us in God's perfect/completed love!
- 2. Spirit-gifted faith sees Jesus not only as ______ and living ____, but also as a <u>man who suffered in human flesh and died (4:2–3)</u>. Jesus is the atoning sacrifice for our sins (4:10). No other sacrifice is necessary! All has been accomplished and completed (4:12, 17, 18) to bring God's unconditional love to us!

3. John's community suffered from a discernment challenge, but today also, God's perfect/fulfilled love for us in Christ Jesus leads us to exercise discernment and "_____ the _____."

- a. The Spirit leads us to discern and confess with our mouths (as our confirmands are doing today) what we believe to be true about Jesus Christ.
- b. The Spirit leads us to live out (however imperfectly, here below) the perfect and unconditional love of God for us that Jesus has made possible.
- 4. Because we are sinners, we cannot help but fear God's punishment, but God's perfect/fulfilled love for us, gifted to us in Christ Jesus, leads us to stand ______ before God now and on the Last Day; it "_____ __" our fear!
 - a. Even though our faith is always--from our point of view—an imperfect and inadequate thing, the Holy Spirit make our unpresentable faith presentable before God.
 - b. Those who wonder if their love will be returned live in fear. We need not live this way! God's love for us was *prior* to our love for God and is *not dependent* on our love for God. We are freed to love God and one another.
