A warm welcome to all worshiping at Resurrection Lutheran Church today! We celebrate together God's work in our lives as we receive His Word to strengthen our relationship with Him and one another. Here, God builds us up by grace, through faith, and for service!

LESSONS AND LITURGY TODAY

Maundy Thursday (most likely from the Latin, *mandatum*, meaning a new commandment) or Holy Thursday begins a single service that spans three days, called the Triduum. What is begun tonight is not concluded until the Easter Vigil or the first Eucharist of Easter Sunday. This is one story told in three parts over three days. This is the story that Jesus began on Palm Sunday when He entered Jerusalem to complete all He had come to accomplish.

The Triduum starts with Passover, the last of the Passovers Jesus would celebrate and the last of the Passovers appointed by God. Things are changing. This final Passover becomes the introduction to the new covenant meal of Jesus' Body and Blood. The joy of this most sacred meal is tinged with sadness. Someone will betray Jesus – someone close to Him. But this sadness is transformed into joy because this meal points to the eternal banquet which Jesus will eat with us and all His saints in Heaven. The betrayal is for a purpose. Jesus will use the events of the next three days to end the reign of sin and death and prepare a whole new future for us, His people. This Holy Supper connects us to what Jesus did and sustains us until we are with Him in Heaven for all eternity.

As the Lutheran Church defines it, God has given two sacraments to his church. They are the Sacrament of Holy Baptism and the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

A sacrament is a personal, tangible way God gives forgiveness and life to his people. There are three things necessary for something to be a sacrament.

- * It must be commanded by Christ.
- * It must use an earthly element, some common item from this world.
- * It brings God's grace and forgiveness to people.

In baptism, God makes us his children, part of his own family. In Holy Communion, he nourishes us in this family. Both of these sacraments convey to us the life, forgiveness and salvation which Jesus won for us on the cross.

These gifts come to us for the first time in our baptism and they come to us again each time we celebrate Holy Communion.

❖ Introduction to Maundy Thursday

- P In this Lenten season, we have heard our Lord's Call to intensify our struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were committed at baptism.
- C God's Forgiveness and the Power of His Spirit to amend our lives continues with us because of His Love for us in Jesus, our Savior.
- P Within the community of the church, God never wearies of giving peace and new life. In the absolution, we receive forgiveness as if from God Himself.

 This absolution we should not doubt, but firmly believe that thereby our sins are forgiven before God in Heaven, for it comes to us in the Name and by the Command of our Lord.
- C We who receive God's Love in Jesus Christ are called to love one another, to be servants to each other as Jesus became our servant.
- P It is, however, in the Holy Communion that the members of Christ's Body participate most intimately in His Love.
- C Remembering our Lord's Last Supper with His disciples, we eat the bread and drink the cup of this meal.

- P Together we receive the Lord's Gift of Himself and participate in that New Covenant which makes us one in Him.
- C The Lord's Supper is the promise of the Great Banquet we will share with all the faithful when our Lord returns, the culmination of our reconciliation with God and each other.

♦ CONFESSION OF SINS

- P In our sin and sinfulness we make excuses, squandering and taking for granted the Grace of God and the Banquet He so freely gives.
- C Most Merciful God, we confess that our very nature is sinful.
 We do not love You with all our heart, soul, mind and strength.
 We do not love our neighbors as ourselves.
 It is natural for us to make excuses when You present Your Gifts to us.
 Because of our selfishness, we deserve to be shut out of the Banquet.
 Though You are Generous in Your Love, we deserve only Your Wrath.
 Forgive us, Most Holy God.

♦ ABSOLUTION

- P Upon this, your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a Called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the Grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the Command of my Lord Jesus Christ and by His Authority, I forgive you all your sins in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.

OLD TESTAMENT

Exodus 12:1-14 [ESV]

(The Lord institutes the Passover)

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt,

"This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you.

Tell all the congregation of Israel that on the tenth day of this month every man shall take a lamb according to their fathers' houses, a lamb for a household. And if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his nearest neighbor shall take according to the number of persons; according to what each can eat you shall make your count for the lamb. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male a year old.

You may take it from the sheep or from the goats, and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill their lambs at twilight. "Then they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted on the fire; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it.

Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted, its head with its legs and its inner parts.

And you shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn.

In this manner you shall eat it: with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand.

And you shall eat it in haste.

It is the LORD's Passover.

For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I Am the LORD.

The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are.
And when I see the blood, I will pass over

And when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt.

and you shall keep it as a feast to the LORD; throughout your generations, as a statute forever, you shall keep it as a feast.

"This day shall be for you a memorial day,

EPISTLE

I Corinthians 11:23-32 [ESV]

(Paul recapitulates the Institution of the Lord's Supper.)

For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when He was betrayed took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and said,

"This is My Body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup, after supper, saying,

"This cup is the New Covenant in My Blood.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

For as often as you eat this Bread and drink the Cup, you proclaim the Lord's Death until He comes.

- L This is the Word of the Lord.
- C Thanks be to God.

Whoever, therefore, eats the Bread or drinks the Cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the Body and Blood of the Lord.

Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the Bread and drink of the Cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the Body eats and drinks judgment on himself.

That is why many of you are weak and ill, and some have died.

But if we judged ourselves truly, we would not be judged.

But when we are judged by the Lord, we are disciplined so that we may not be condemned along with the world.

John 13:1-17, 31b-35 [ESV]

♦ HOLY GOSPEL

(Jesus washes the disciples' feet.)

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the thirteenth chapter.

C Glory to You, O Lord.

Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that His Hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end.

During supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray Him,

Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His Hands, and that He had come from God and was going back to God, rose from supper.

He laid aside His outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around His waist. Then He poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around Him.

He came to Simon Peter, who said to Him, "Lord, do You wash my feet?" Jesus answered him,

"What I Am doing you do not understand now, but afterward you will understand." Peter said to Him,

"You shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered him,

"If I do not wash you, you have no share with me."

Simon Peter said to Him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him,

"The one who has bathed does not need to wash, except for his feet, but is completely clean. And you are clean, but not every one of you."

For He knew who was to betray Him; that was why He said,

"Not all of you are clean."

When He had washed their feet and put on His outer garments and resumed His Place, He said to them,

"Do you understand what I have done to you?

You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am.

If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet.

For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you. Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master,

nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him.

If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them.

Jesus said,

"Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in Him.

If God is glorified in Him, God will also glorify Him in Himself, and glorify Him at once.

Little children, yet a little while I am with you.

You will seek me, and just as I said to the Jews, so now I also say to you, 'Where I am going you cannot come.'

A new Commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are My Disciples, if you have love for one another."

- P This is the Gospel of the Lord.

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STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

After the Last Supper, events in our Lord's life moved rapidly: prayer in Gethsemane, betrayal by Judas, arrest, mock trial, painful beating, the trudge to Golgotha and execution. As his life was stripped from him, so we strip our altar of the signs of life to point to His purposeful, redemptive suffering and death for us.

REMOVAL OF THE ALTAR CANDLES

Psalm 27:1-4 [ESV]

(Jesus said, "I am the Light of the world. Whoever follows Me will have the light of life and will never walk in darkness."

The events of Golgotha snuffed out the human life of Jesus, the light of the world.

As even creation was dark when He suffered, so we extinguish our candles and remove them.)

The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?
When evildoers assail me to eat up my flesh, my adversaries and foes, it is they who stumble and fall.
Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear;

though war arise against me, yet I will be confident.
One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the House of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to inquire in His Temple.

REMOVAL OF OFFERING PLATES

2 Corinthians 8:8-9 [ESV]

(Our offerings represent one way of serving God and others. They reflect God's greatest offering to the world and to us in sending His Son, Jesus, in human form. As the offered body of Jesus was removed from sight in burial, so we remove our offerings.)

I say this not as a command, but to prove by the earnestness of others that your love also is genuine. For you know the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sake He became poor, so that you by His poverty might become rich.

REMOVAL OF THE ALTAR BOOKS

Psalm 20:1-4 [ESV]

(The missal stand holds our worship books that guide our worship life together as we sing praises to God.

As Jesus suffers, joyous songs are not heard.

As these sounds of joy are removed from our lips, we remove the missal stand.)

May the LORD answer you in the day of trouble!
May the Name of the God of Jacob protect you!
May He send you help from the sanctuary and give you support from Zion!

May He remember all your offerings and regard with favor your burnt sacrifices! *Selah*May He grant you your heart's desire and fulfill all your plans!

Psalm 22:1-5 [ESV]

(Jesus' offered body and His shed blood have been given to us in, with, and under the form of bread and wine in this holy mystery.

As He was removed from us in the grave, so we remove the elements and vessels of this Sacrament.)

My God, my God, why have You forsaken me?
Why are You so far from saving me, from the words of my groaning?
O my God, I cry by day, but You do not answer,
and by night, but I find no rest.

Yet You are Holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel. In You our fathers trusted; they trusted, and You delivered them. To You they cried and were rescued; in You they trusted and were not put to shame.

REMOVAL OF THE PARAMENTS

Psalm 88:4-18 [ESV]

(Our altar is in the form of a table. It is here where our Lord Jesus serves us as both host and meal at his banquet feast.

The coverings are made of fine linen; materials appropriate for feasting with our King.

As our King's body was stripped in crucifixion, so our altar is stripped of its coverings.)

I am counted among those who go down to the pit;

I am a man who has no strength, like one set loose among the dead, like the slain that lie in the grave, like those whom You remember no more, for they are cut off from Your Hand. You have put me in the depths of the pit, in the regions dark and deep. Your Wrath lies heavy upon me, and You overwhelm me with all Your waves. *Selah* You have caused my companions to shun

You have made me a horror to them. I am shut in so that I cannot escape; my eye grows dim through sorrow. Every day I call upon You, O LORD; I spread out my hands to You. Do You work wonders for the dead? Do the departed rise up to praise You? Selah Is Your Steadfast Love declared in the grave, or Your Faithfulness in Abaddon? Are Your Wonders known in the darkness, or Your Righteousness in the land

of forgetfulness?

But I, O LORD, cry to You; in the morning my prayer comes before You.

O LORD, why do You cast my soul away? Why do You hide Your Face from me? Afflicted and close to death from my youth up,

I suffer Your terrors; I am helpless.

Your Wrath has swept over me; Your dreadful assaults destroy me.

They surround me like a flood all day

long;

they close in on me together.

You have caused my beloved and my friend to shun me;

my companions have become darkness.

Matthew 26:30, 36-38 [ESV]

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And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and He said to His disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray."

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And taking with Him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, He began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then He said to them, "My Soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with Me."
