LESSONS AND LITURGY TODAY

Greet one another with the ringing shout, "Christ is risen!"

The stone has been rolled away. The tomb stands open wide.

Christ's resurrection makes possible the rolling away of the stone of eternal death for His Easter people. And even more – the huge stone of despair, discouragement, doubt, and defeat can be rolled away from each Christian's heart.

In response we say and sing, "Alleluia!"

Easter begins the church's season of "Alleluias."

They have been omitted during Lent in the contemplation of Christ's suffering.

This morning may our "Alleluias" soar Heavenward.

The congregation is encouraged to quietly and prayerfully prepare for worship during the prelude.

❖ INVOCATION

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

- **P** In Baptism your old sinful nature was buried with Christ when He died. When God the Father brought Him back to life again, you were given His wonderful new life to enjoy. To remind ourselves of what happens at our baptism, we speak the words that were spoken at our baptism:
- C In the Name of the Father and of the Son ₹ and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

❖ PROCESSIONAL HYMN

- C Amen. Thanks be to God!


♦ PRAYER OF THE DAY


- P Let us pray.



(The Resurrection of Jesus from the dead)

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twentieth chapter.



Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark,

and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb.

So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them,

"They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid Him."

So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going toward the tomb. Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first.

And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb.

He saw the linen cloths lying there, and the face cloth,

which had been on Jesus' Head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself.

Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that He must rise from the dead.

Then the disciples went back to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb, and as she wept she stooped to look into the tomb.

And she saw two angels in white, sitting where the Body of Jesus had lain, one at the head and one at the feet.

They said to her,

"Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them,

"They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid Him." Having said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus.

Jesus said to her,

"Woman, why are you weeping?

Whom are you seeking?"

Supposing Him to be the gardener, she said to Him,

"Sir, if you have carried Him away, tell me where you have laid Him, and I will take Him away."

Jesus said to her,

"Mary."

She turned and said to Him in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not cling to Me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to My brothers and say to them,

'I Am ascending to My Father and your Father, to My God and your God."' Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples,

"I have seen the Lord"—and that He had said these things to her.

The Last Thing We Ever Expected *John 20:1-18*

- AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

 Luther's Explanation to the Second Article of the Ancient Apostles' Creed
 - C I believe that Jesus Christ –
 True God, begotten of the Father from eternity,
 and also True Man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord,
 Who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person,
 purchased and won me from all sins, from death,
 and from the power of the devil;
 not with gold or silver, but with His Holy, Precious Blood
 and with His Innocent Suffering and Death,
 that I may be His own
 and live under Him in His Kingdom

and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness,

just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.
