And when Paul had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go on into Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the Gospel to them. Hope for the City (Revelation 21:9-14, 21-27) Easter 6, Series C

1. Today is the fifth week of our sermon series on singing a new song of praise to
our risen King. We sing as people made beautiful and built up to reflect the
glory of God as the of, the New Jerusalem (21:10). Because of
Jesus there is hope today for human community on earth!
2. There are two cities in the Scriptures that almost serve as bookends for the
books of the Bible: a half-built city from the beginning of time ("" in
Gen 11:1-9) and a glorious and holy city at the end of time and in eternity,
"The New Jerusalem." The first city reflects a self-absorbed humanity estranged
from God. The second, a gift "coming down from heaven," is a city humanity could
never have built alone!
3. The present Easter season is a time to see ourselves as the End Time New
Jerusalem despite the ruins of Babel now. Though we know what it means for our
human community (universities, companies, familieseven churches) to be
fractured and broken, though we know what it means to be unworthy of God's
love, the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ builds us up as a people
united around the and the Our sins are forgiven!
We are declared holy by the blood of the Lamb! Because of the crucified and risen
Christ there is hope for all human community on earth!
4 That we have have for the city/somewhat of Cod on conth manner in
4. That we have hope for the city/community of God on earth means we live
with hope for, too. We do not yet see the New
Jerusalem with our own eyes, but with the eyes of faith. Seeing it in faith, we rejoice!
And in Hebrews we read where that joy leads: "Let brotherly love continueHere
we have no lasting city, but we seek the City that is to come!" (13:1, 14). The Holy
City that will offer rest to the weary sinner, gates open to all, and opportunities to
see and enjoy God's glory together is our reason to live and serve our own cities and
communities together right now. How will God lead you to "seek the City that is to
come" in your life this week?
