#### Messy Discipleship

Galatians 6:1-10, 14-18 [ESV]

(Paul encourages us to do good to all people.)

Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted.

Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the Law of Christ.

For if anyone thinks he is something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself. But let each one test his own work, and then his reason to boast will be in himself alone and not in his neighbor. For each will have to bear his own load. Let the one who is taught the Word share all good things with the one who teaches.

Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap Eternal Life. And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up.

Luke 10:1-20 [ESV]

(Jesus sends out disciples to announce peace.)

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the tenth chapter.
- C Glory to You, O Lord.
- P After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of Him, two by two, into every town and place where He Himself was about to go.

  And He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few.

  Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the Harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road.

  Whatever house you enter, first say,
- C 'Peace be to this house.'

P And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him.

But if not, it will return to you.

And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages.

Do not go from house to house.

Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you.

Heal the sick in it and say to them,

- C 'The Kingdom of God has come near to you.'
- P But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say,
- C 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the Kingdom of God has come near.'
- P I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.

"Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida!

For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes.

But it will be more bearable in the judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you.

And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to Heaven?

You shall be brought down to Hades.

"The one who hears you hears Me, and the one who rejects you rejects Me, and the one who rejects Me rejects Him Who sent Me."

The seventy-two returned with joy, saying,

- C "Lord, even the demons are subject to us in Your Name!"
- P And He said to them, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy,
- P and nothing shall hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in Heaven.
- P This is the Gospel of the Lord.

## Messy Discipleship, 3: "I Will Comfort You" (Isaiah 66:10-14) Proper 9, Series C

Discipleship looks "messy" considering the scared, sad, and confused people we often are. How are we to meaningfully engage the world when the losses of life get us down? The picture of God comforting God's people like a woman nursing and playing with her infant child restructures our expectations for the future around a God who gives grace to the helpless. We the tiny, powerless children of God, follow!

1.	We all have an idea of what comfort <i>should</i> look like. <b>True comfort is the</b> we yearn for when faced with and the fear, grief, and confusion can bring. Messy disciples that we are, we are laid low by the unpredictable and unforeseen changes that life brings and that we find ourselves ill-equipped to manage alone.
2.	God's people returned to Jerusalem in 538 BCE to pick up the pieces of shattered lives. Their temple was in ruins and their city a shadow of its earlier glory. Here we get picture of <i>God's</i> comfort. <b>True comfort is God's gift of</b> and for the, depicted as a mother who
	nurses and plays with her baby! The grace to see themselves as babies led Israel to see God as the parent who loved them and would give them all they truly needed.
3.	True comfort is God's gift of for loss, where Jesus weeps with the sorrowful yet calls the dead from the darkness of the tomb to life (John 11:35; 43)! Through Jesus, God demonstrates that He cares, even—especially—for messy disciples in their time of loss. Through Jesus, God gives comfort to those who need it most.
4.	An old proverb says that shared sorrow is the sorrow, and shared joy is the joy. What burdens is God's comfort in Jesus calling you to let go of today? What joys can you, by the work of the Holy Spirit, share with others that will bring even greater joy to your community?
