### The First Candle: The Prophecy Candle

- P As we light the first candle on our Advent wreath, we recall with thanksgiving the vivid and courageous words and actions of the prophets. Called by God and overtaken by the Word, they spoke forth God's Truth and pointed to the coming of the Messiah. Their words still call us to faith and to action.
- C Lord Christ, come among us and by Your Spirit, grant us the courage to speak and to act as those who have been called and chosen to carry Your Word to our world. Raise up among us wise and faithful messengers of Your Grace and Peace. In Your Strong Name, Amen.

### **Confession of Sins and Good News of God's Forgiveness**

- P Be careful, or your hearts will be weighed down with the anxieties of life. Be always on watch and take time to pray.
- C Most Merciful God, You are our Righteousness. As Your baptized children, we are saved. Yet today we confess how often we do not live, speak, or think like Your Own people.

Untie them and bring them to me. <sup>3</sup> If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." <sup>4</sup> This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying, <sup>5</sup> "Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden.'" <sup>6</sup> The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. <sup>7</sup> They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. <sup>8</sup> Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. <sup>9</sup> And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" <sup>10</sup> And when he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?" <sup>11</sup> And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee." # From the Cross to the Manger (Matthew 21:1-11) Advent 1, 2022

The first day of the new church year is here! As we get out the decorations and start rubbing shoulders with Christmas shoppers it may seems odd, at first, that our gospel reading contains what we normally think of as a Palm Sunday event (Jesus entry into Jerusalem)! What gives? Advent (and therefore, Christmas) begins not with Mary and Joseph but with our need for a Savior who *COMES* to rescue His people.

1.	Before a meal we may often pray, "Come, Lord Jesus." Why? To acknowledge Jesus
	and as we share a meal together. It's not because we have a superstitious fear that
	Jesus isn't around unless we pray for Him to show up. Even though we can't see Jesus, He is always
	with us. Even the ordinary blessing of food is a sign of His faithfulnessHis hand of provision.
2.	Our prayer, "Come, Lord Jesus" begins with the, "Look, Your King
	comes to you!" (Zech 5:5). Though some of those welcoming Jesus to Jerusalem may have had a
	notion that Jesus came to do more than serve Israel as a political ruler, Jesus' coming to save did not
	depend on their readiness to receive Him. He fulfilled Zechariah's prophey that Israel's king would
	come to her "humble, and mounted on a donkey."
3.	Our prayer, "Come, Lord Jesus" is a to the of God's people expressed
	in the song, "Blessed is He/the King who comes in the Name of the Lord!" (Ps 118:26; Matt 21:9; Lk

	beginnings and in our endings! We are never completely ready. But we pray that Jesus come to us,
	especially right here and now. So, strange as it might seem, Christmas begins with this picture of Palm
