After this Jesus revealed Himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and He revealed Himself in this way. Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of His disciples were together.

Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing."
They said to him, "We will go with you."

They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on

the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus.

Jesus said to them,

"Children, do you have any fish?"

They answered Him, "No."

He said to them,

"Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some."

So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, because of the quantity of fish.

That disciple whom Jesus loved therefore said to Peter,

When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work, and threw himself into the sea.

The other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off.

When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire in place, with fish laid out on it, and bread.

Jesus said to them,

"Bring some of the fish that you have just caught."

So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, 153 of them.

And although there were so many, the net was not torn.

Jesus said to them,

Now none of the disciples dared ask Him,

"Who are you?"

They knew it was the Lord.

Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish.

This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after He was raised from the dead.

John 21:1–14

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His Only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven and sits at the Right Hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the Life & Everlasting. Amen.

THE ORDINATION

The candidate is presented before the altar.

The presiding minister, standing before the altar, says:

- P In the Name of the Father and of the ♥ Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.

The presiding minister addresses the congregation:

P Beloved in the Lord, Zachery Sarrault has been called by the Lord of the Church into the Office of the Holy Ministry of the Word and Sacraments. He has been prepared for this ministry by careful study and prayer. He has been examined and declared ready and prepared to undertake this sacred responsibility, and, by the guidance of God the Holy Spirit, he has in the Church's usual order been called to be Associate Pastor of Resurrection Lutheran Church, Cary, NC.

- P According to apostolic practice, he is now presented to be ordained and consecrated to this office established by God.
- P The Lord be with you.
- C And also with you.
- P Let us pray:

O God, You once taught the hearts of Your faithful people by sending them the light of Your Holy Spirit. Grant us in our day by the same Spirit to have a right understanding in all things and evermore to rejoice in His holy consolation; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, Who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

THE INSTITUTION OF THE OFFICE OF THE HOLY MINISTRY

The presiding minister turns to the candidate and says:

P Hear what Holy Scripture says concerning the institution of the Office of the Holy Ministry.

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

[John 20:21-23]

THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE OFFICE OF THE HOLY MINISTRY

P Hear what Holy Scripture says concerning the responsibilities of the Office of the Holy Ministry.

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. (II Corinthians 5:17-21)

THE STRENGTH AND PROMISE IN THE OFFICE OF THE HOLY MINISTRY

P Hear what Holy Scripture says concerning the strength and promise God gave to those in the Office of the Holy Ministry.

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work. (2 Tim. 3:14—17)

The presiding minister addresses the candidate:

- P Dear brother in Christ, the Lord grant that you receive and keep these words in your heart so that you may be strengthened and encouraged in your labors.
- P God gathers His Church by and around His Holy Gospel and thereby also grants it growth and increase according to His Good Pleasure. That this may be done, He has established the Office of the Holy Ministry into which you have been called by the Church and are now to be ordained and consecrated by prayer and the laying on of hands.
- P In the presence of this congregation, and before our Lord God to whom you must give an account now and at the Last Day, I now ask you:
- P Do you acknowledge that the Lord has called you through His Church into the ministry of Word and Sacrament?
- R I do.
- P Do you believe and confess the canonical books of the Old and New Testaments to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice?
- R Yes, I believe and confess the canonical Scriptures to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
- P Do you believe and confess the three ecumenical Creeds, namely, the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds, as faithful testimonies to the truth of the Holy Scriptures, and do you reject all the errors which they condemn?

- R Yes, I believe and confess the three Ecumenical Creeds because they are in accord with the Word of God. I also reject all the errors they condemn.
- P Do you confess the Unaltered Augsburg Confession to be a true exposition of Holy Scripture and a correct exhibition of the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church?

 And do you confess that the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Small and Large Catechisms of Martin Luther, the Smalcald Articles, the Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope, and the Formula of Concord—as these are contained in the Book of Concord—are also in agreement with this one scriptural faith?
- R Yes, I make these Confessions my own because they are in accord with the Word of God.
- P Do you promise that you will perform the duties of your office in accordance with these Confessions, and that all your preaching and teaching and your administration of the Sacraments will be in conformity with Holy Scripture and with these Confessions?
- R Yes, I promise with the Help of God.
- P Will you faithfully instruct both young and old in the chief articles of Christian doctrine, will you forgive the sins of those who repent, and will you promise never to divulge the sins confessed to you? Will you minister faithfully to the sick and dying, and will you demonstrate to the Church a constant and ready ministry centered in the Gospel? Will you admonish and encourage the people to a lively confidence in Christ and in holy living?
- R Yes, I will with the Help of God.
- P Finally, will you honor and adorn the Office of the Holy Ministry with a holy life? Will you be diligent in the study of Holy Scripture and the Confessions? And will you be constant in prayer for those under your pastoral care?
- R I will, the Lord helping me through the power and grace of His Holy Spirit.

The candidate kneels. The presiding minister lays his hands directly on the head of the candidate and says:

P [Jesus said:] "Peace be to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." [John 20:21-23]

P Zachery Sarrault, I ordain and consecrate you to the Office of the Holy Ministry of the Word and Sacraments in the one, holy, Christian, and apostolic Church, in the Name of the Father and of the ▼ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C Amen

P The Lord Jesus pour out on you His Holy Spirit for this office and work that you may faithfully preach the Gospel and administer the Sacraments. Amen.

The assisting pastors, each in turn lay their hands directly on the newly ordained, adding an appropriate blessing or passage from the Word of God

Hands are laid on the newly ordained while the congregation prays the Lord's Prayer.

LORD'S PRAYER

The newly ordained stands and is vested with a stole.

The presiding minister and the newly ordained turn to face the congregation. The presiding minister says:

P Beloved in the Lord, Holy Scripture says,

"Obey your leaders and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you." (Heb. 13:17)

- P Will you, the faithful, according to the Church's public confession, and speaking for the whole Church, receive Zachery Sarrault as a servant of Christ and minister of Word and Sacrament? If so, answer: We will.
- C We will.
- P Let us pray:
 - O Eternal, Merciful God, You have spoken through Your Own Dear Son, saying that the harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few and that we should ask You, the Lord of the Harvest, to send laborers into Your Harvest. Hear now our prayer on behalf of Zachery Sarrault, who this day is ordained and consecrated to be Your minister in the Church. Strengthen him mightily to take up the Word of truth and faithfully to administer Your Holy Sacraments.
- P O Lord Jesus Christ, our Great High Priest, You gave Your Own Life to be a holy and perfect sacrifice for us and for our salvation. Grant Zachery Sarrault a heart zealous for Your people and boldness to guide, comfort, admonish, and serve Your congregation with gentleness and wisdom. Fill him, Your undershepherd, with Your Love that in Your Name he will seek the straying and bear up the weak. Give him the heart never to grow weary in the service of Your flock.
- P O Holy Spirit, strengthen and keep Zachery Sarrault in the Word of truth and life, and support him in every time of trouble and distress. Make his labors fruitful and, when the day of labor is ended, grant him to come with rejoicing before Your Presence to receive with all the saints his portion in eternal salvation.
- P To You, O Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be all glory and honor, both now and forever.

THE INSTALLATION

If so, answer: We will with the Help of God.

- P Will you honor and uphold your pastor as he serves Christ in all his God-pleasing responsibilities? Will you aid him as he cares for his family? Will you be diligent to "put the best construction on everything," recognizing that "love covers a multitude of sins"? If so, answer: We will with the Help of God.
- C We will with the Help of God.
- P The Almighty and Most Merciful God strengthen and assist you always.

The presiding minister asks the newly ordained:

- P Are you willing and ready to assume this public trust and responsibility?
- R I am.
- P Zachery Sarrault, I install you as Associate Pastor of Resurrection Lutheran Church in the Name of the Father and of the A Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen
- P Now may the God of Peace Who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the Great Shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the Eternal Covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do His Will, working in us that which is pleasing in His Sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. (Heb. 13:20-21)
- C Amen
- P Let us pray:

Almighty and Most Merciful God and Father, through Your Only-Begotten Son, Jesus Christ, You have established Your Church to be a temple and dwelling place of the Holy Spirit.

We give thanks that You continue to provide shepherds to feed and serve Your Flock over which the Holy Spirit has made them overseers.

- 4. Through toil and tribulation And tumult of her war She waits the consummation Of peace forevermore Till with the vision glorious Her longing eyes are blest, And the great Church victorious Shall be the Church at rest.
- 5. Yet she on earth has union With God, the Three in One, And mystic sweet communion With those whose rest is won. O blessèd heav'nly chorus! Lord, save us by Your grace That we, like saints before us, May see You face to face.
